SCENE 1: THE POPCORN PRESS CONFERENCE

SFX BANGING OF A GAVEL

POPCORN Order! Okay! So the motion has passed. We, the popcorn

LEADER: people of Entertainia III, are in a state of emergency. The old

films just aren't satisfying any more. Our people are rioting in the streets. There is only one course of action we can take. It may seem drastic, but... We're going to have to make a movie

of our own.

VICE LEADER But how are we going to do that?

POPCORN We'll form a committee to look into the creation of a new

LEADER: premise. A new script! And then we'll get to work.

VICE LEADER But sir, isn't this just... patching up the problem? Wouldn't it be

better to --

POPCORN We, the popcorn people of our popcorn nation, are proud

LEADER: patchers of our popcorn problems! It's what we've always done

and what we will continue to do!

VICE LEADER But -

POPCORN SILENCE! Form the exploratory committee and start pitching

LEADER: some screenplays! And remember, a problem patched, is a

problem patched!

SFX: RIOTOUS APPLAUSE

SCENE 2: THE WRITER'S DEN

SFX: TYPEWRITERS CLANK

WRITER 1: ...So then she's standing in front of him, heart in her hand

WRITER 2: I thought we were staying away from horror!

WRITER 1: I meant metaphorically.

WRITER 3: I thought we were staying away from metaphors!

WRITER 1: Just hear me out, okay? So she's standing in front of him, heart

in hand -- metaphorically -- and she says "See, I'm just a

popcorn girl standing in front of a popcorn boy, asking them..."

WRITER 3: Asking them what?

WRITER 1: I... I haven't got there yet.

WRITER 2: That's your big idea? Where's the rest of the movie?

VICE Wait -- I'm sorry, we've checked the Im-DUB scrolls and... I

LEADER: think there's something like that already. It's lost, but it existed.

WRITER 2: If it's lost, can't we just -- make it?

WRITER 1: You mean -- make a remake?

SFX A COLLECTIVE SHUDDER.

WRITER 2: You're right. It has to be completely original. I'm sorry I even

suggested for a moment...

WRITER 1: Why can't we just rerun some of the classics again?

VICE You heard the leader, it's just not working any more.

LEADER:

WRITER 2: Okay, okay, SO! I've got one. A secret agent. Right?

WRITER 1: Right.

WRITER 2: But this one's deeply flawed. He's got outdated views, a

crippling sex addiction and a license to kill.

WRITER 1: And -- so who's the hero?

WRITER 2: He is.

WRITER 1: I don't... think anyone will watch that.

SFX FRANTIC TYPING

VICE Actually, apparently there was an entire franchise based around

LEADER: that concept exactly.

WRITER 1: Well then it's not original, is it?

WRITER 2: Okay, so if we don't want a secret agent -- how about just a

guy! He's -- in a tower, dealing with a hostage situation, and --

WRITER 1: I like it, but -- I think you're ripping off Brucemas.

WRITER 2: Oh.

WRITER 1: Okay! I have it! So there's this prison spaceship full of criminals,

and one of the criminals is actually a good guy --

WRITER 2: Right?

WRITER 1: And he has to stop them from taking over. And he's got long,

flowing hair.

WRITER 3: Uh. Nope, it's been done.

VICE Okay. Right. So how about a ship that, once it goes above 1

LEADER: light year per hour, is rigged to explode if it decelerates?

WRITER 2: Couldn't they just point it at a sun and -- evacuate it?

VICE Maybe they don't have escape pods.

LEADER:

WRITER 2: They could just send out a mayday. Then someone could fly up

alongside them and help.

VICE But what if nobody is nearby?

LEADER:

WRITER 3: They could just fly in circles until they get help.

VICE Okay. Fine. That wouldn't work.

LEADER:

WRITER 2: Maybe -- maybe it just needs to be relatable. Just a couple of

workers going about their day... Maybe repairmen, to appeal to

the bluecollar market? And they work for this big corporation

and --

WRITER 1: That's the worst idea I've ever heard.

VICE These ideas just aren't going to work. We need to write what

LEADER: we KNOW.

WRITER 3: Right. Right. How about -- a race of people stuck on a planet!

WRITER 1: Yes! I like it!

WRITER 3: The main characters are -- are film makers!

VICE Brilliant! What are they like?

LEADER:

WRITER 3: Buttery and charismatic!

WRITER 1: Yes! But... why are they trapped?

WRITER 3: They know that there's a big wide universe out there. A

universe of -- endless wonder and really interesting things. But

they can't get off of the ground.

VICE So what -- what do they do?

LEADER:

Writer 3: I guess they have to find a way to leave?

WRITER 1: But how? We can't -- I mean, they can't - it's impossible!

WRITER 3: Maybe they -- maybe they make a ship.

VICE But out of what?

LEADER:

WRITER 1: Old projector parts?
